Definitions

1 In this Regulation,

- (a) “Act” means the *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act*;
- (b) “Authority” means the Authority referred to in section 2 of the *Designated Material Recycling and Management Regulation* (AR 93/2004);
- (c) “Bylaw” means a Bylaw of the Authority made under section 12 of the *Designated Material Recycling and Management Regulation* (AR 93/2004);
- (d) “container” means a container in which lubricating oil is supplied and that has a capacity of 30 litres or less;
- (e) “filter” means any spin-on or element style fluid filter that is used in hydraulic or internal combustion engine applications, but does not include a gasoline fuel filter;
- (f) “lubricating oil” means petroleum-derived or synthetic crankcase oil, engine oil, hydraulic fluid, transmission fluid, gear oil, heat transfer fluid or other oil or fluid used for lubricating purposes in machinery or equipment;
- (g) “lubricating oil material” means lubricating oil, containers and filters;
- (h) “supply” means to sell or otherwise transfer.

Lubricating oil material as designated material

2 Lubricating oil material is designated as designated material for the purposes of Part 9, Division 1 of the Act and the *Designated Material Recycling and Management Regulation* (AR 93/2004).

Maximum surcharge

3 For the purposes of the *Designated Material Recycling and Management Regulation* (AR 93/2004), the maximum surcharge that may be prescribed by Bylaw for lubricating oil material is as follows:

- (a) for lubricating oil, \$0.05 per litre or kilogram;
- (b) for containers, \$0.05 per litre of container size;
- (c) for filters,
 - (i) \$0.50 for filters less than 203 mm in length, and
 - (ii) \$1 for filters 203 mm in length or longer.

Repeal

4 The *Lubricating Oil Material Recycling and Management Regulation* (AR 82/97) is repealed.

Expiry

5 For the purpose of ensuring that this Regulation is reviewed for ongoing relevancy and necessity, with the option that it may be repassed in its present or an amended form following a review, this Regulation expires on June 30, 2021.

Coming into force

6 This Regulation comes into force on October 1, 2018.
