



Tire Recycling Program Products, Definitions and Surcharges

Following is the list of tire product categories designated under the *Designated Materials Regulation*, for which surcharges are charged on the sale of new tires in the Yukon. Surcharges apply whether new tires are purchased within the Yukon or online. Surcharges are deposited into the Recycling Fund, and are used solely for the management of the recycling program. These product categories and associated surcharges came into effect October 1, 2018.

Tire Category: Passenger and Light Truck	Surcharge
<p>This category includes but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Passenger and Light Truck tires (including temporary spare tires) designed for use on passenger cars, light trucks (consumer or commercial under 10,000 lbs. gross vehicle weight) and multipurpose passenger vehicles (MPVs), including sport and crossover utility vehicles (SUVs and CUVs) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Sidewalls may be marked “P”, “LT” and general fall under the Canadian Moto Vehicle Standard CMVSS No. 109, 119 & 139 and sections 1, 2, 6 & 7 of the Tire and Rim Association Yearbook. ▪ Medium truck tires with a rim diameter of 19.5 inches (49.53 cm) or less 	\$7





Tire Category: Specialty, Industrial and Other Tires	Surcharge
<p>This category includes but is not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Specialty, Industrial and Other Tires with a rim diameter of 8 inches (20 cm) up to and including 24 inches (61 cm) such as tires designed for use on a: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Skid steer, mini-loader ○ Forklift ○ Compactor Road Roller Tires, 15 and 20 inch 	\$7
<p>Excluded products:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Aviation tires ▪ Electric bike and bicycle tires ▪ Electric scooter tires with a rim diameter less than 8 inches ▪ Farm/Agricultural tires, both drive and free rolling tires for farm implements, tractors and other farm equipment with the following sidewall codes: F-1, F-2, F-2M, F-2D, R-1, R-1W, R-2, R-3, HF-1, HF-2, HF-3, HF-4, I-1, I-2, I-3, IMP, IMP FLOTATION 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Hand-powered equipment tires, e.g. wheelbarrows, wagons, dollies, wheelchairs, bicycles, hand-powered lawn and garden equipment ▪ Mini-bike, quad and moped tires where the tire rim size is less than 8 inches ▪ Segway tires ▪ Motorized mobility aid tires

Tire Category: Medium Truck Tires	Surcharge
<p>This category includes tires with rim sizes greater than 19.5 inches (50 cm) including, but not limited to tires designed for use on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Highway tractor trucks, commercial trucks, and buses ▪ Larger RV tires and larger trailers tires <p>Tires in this category generally fall under the Canadian Motor Vehicle Standard CMVSS No. 120 (TSD 120) and section 3 of the Tire and Time Association Yearbook with sidewall codes including TBM-4R, HC-2, TTB-3R, WBTB-3R.</p> <p>(Truck tires with a rim diameter from 17.5 inches (44.45 cm) to 19.5 inches (50 cm) are excluded from this category; and the PLT fee of \$7 applies.)</p>	\$9





Tire Category: Recreational vehicle tires	Surcharge
<p>This category includes tires with a rim diameter of at least 8 inches (20 cm) up to and including 24 inches (61 cm), for use on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Trailers, including but not limited to boat, utility, cargo, livestock, flatbed, recreation/travel ○ Motorcycle (both on and off road), motorized scooters (does not include motorized mobility aids), sidecar, other personal transportation vehicles ○ All-terrain vehicles (ATV), lawn tractors, golf carts 	\$5

Tire Category: Off-the-Road (OTR)	Surcharge
<p>This category includes the Off-the-Road (OTR) Tire designation used by the tire industry, and includes tires for use on industrial vehicles or industrial equipment that are not licensed for highway use, including equipment and vehicles for excavation, hauling, loading, logging, and materials handling, but excluding agricultural vehicles and equipment. Examples include dozers, graders, mobile cranes, compactors, and skidders. Products in this category include G2 and L2 tires (small, medium or large based on size).</p> <p>OTR tires may have tread coding of “LS”, “C”, “E”, “G”, “L” and sidewalls may be marked “TG”, “ML”, “DT”, or “K” and generally fall under section 4 of the Tire and Rim Association Yearbook.</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Small OTR: Tires with rim sizes ranging from a diameter of 8 inches (20 cm) up to and including 24 inches (61 cm) ▪ Medium OTR: Tires with rim sizes ranging from a diameter of over 24 inches (61 cm) up to and including 33 inches (84 cm). ▪ Large OTR: Tires with rim sizes ranging from a from a diameter of over 33 inches (84 cm) up to and including 39 inches (99 cm). 	<p>\$40</p> <p>\$100</p> <p>\$200</p>
<p>Excluded products:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Large OTR tires with a rim size greater than 39 inches (99 cm). 	





Tires excluded from Surcharges:

- Used / recapped or retreaded tires
- Tires for wheelbarrows or other machines/devices that are propelled solely by human or animal power
- Bicycle tires (for cycles that are propelled only by human power, electricity, or both)
- Tires for motorized mobility aids (e.g., wheelchairs)
- Polyurethane tires
- Solid rubber tires

Notes:

- This is not considered an exhaustive list of possible tire types or categories that are designated.
- Foam-filled tires are 'designated' according to the product categories above.
- GST applies to the Surcharge when a retailer charges the Surcharge to their customer.
